The dissemination event is sponsored by the British Academy and forms part of the British Academy Small Grant Research Project (Ref. Ref. SG10153) titled, 'The possibility of local actors shaping an understanding of poverty? Experiences from Kerala in southern India'. The project investigators are *Dr. Deepak Gopinath* (University of Dundee) and *Prof. Murali Nair* (Cleveland State University)
